

Destination: Greece



It's official! Greece opens to all tourists on June 15th and will become one of the first European countries to do so. Greece is leading the way with strict precautions in place, the country is ready for its summer tourism comeback. All hospitality establishments will follow strict health protocols to ensure the maximum safety for both residents and visitors. In addition to being one of the first, Greece is also one of the safest destinations to travel to in Europe having the lowest reported Corona virus cases, with only 2 in Crete and 0 in the outlying Islands.

Key dates:

June 15 – International flights into Athens resume. Greece opens to tourists from 29 countries (Albania, Australia, Austria, Northern Macedonia, Bulgaria, Germany, Denmark, Switzerland, Estonia, Japan, Israel, China, Croatia, Cyprus, Latvia, Lebanon, Lithuania, Malta, Montenegro, Hungary, Romania, New Zealand, Norway, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Korea, Czech Republic, and Finland) approved by The Ministry of Tourism. Visitors from these countries will be subject to sample testing at the border.

Tourists from all other countries, including the United Kingdom, will be required to test for Coronavirus upon their arrival and spend one night at a designated hotel. If the test is negative

they will be required to self-isolate for 7 days, if the test is positive they will be obliged to quarantine for 14 days under supervision with expenses covered by the host country.

July 1 – International flights are expanded to all Greek airports. More restrictions will be eased and additional countries will be added to the list.



“Health First”

Greece is resuming tourism under strict health & safety government protocols which will apply to hotels, tourist buses, rental cars, sea transfers, flights and airport terminals.

When you arrive:

- Your car transfer will be allowed only a limited number of people on board at a time based on its size.
- Your villa will have a “Health First” sign indicating all staff received a 2-week training on health & safety protocol from The Ministry of Tourism. This will include hygiene, cleaning, linen and laundry, pool, medical kit training and more. Information leaflets will be provided regarding the dedicated coordinator on site, medical emergency, and social distancing regulations. Staff will be tested and thermal screening will be conducted every morning.
- You will have extra space at the beach in line with social distancing rules
